Education/Scholarship

Scholarships

The Chapter will award (or renew) nine \$2500 scholarships this year.

Seven 2007 scholarship winners will be eligible for renewals if they meet our renewal criteria of 3.3 cumulative GPA with no grade below a B-minus, but experience suggests that one or two of last year's winners will not meet these criteria. Thus, we should be able to award two to four new scholarships. New scholarship awards are not limited to graduating high school seniors. Current undergraduates are also eligible to apply.

We advertise the availability of these scholarships to public school systems and counselors in the South Hampton Roads area through various channels but outreach to private high schools and current undergraduates is difficult. Please let your friends, acquaintances and associates whose children may be eligible to apply that these scholarships are available.

Science Fair

The 57th annual Tidewater Regional Science Fair is scheduled for March 8, 2008 at ODU's Webb Center.

Funding for this event has depended entirely on the generosity of corporate and private donors since 2004.

This private "no strings attached" financial support has made a difference because it has allowed the Tidewater Science Congress to eliminate public-funding restrictions that had limited participation in the Science Fair to students from school districts that had contributed funds to the Fair. The number of student projects has increased from 110 in 2004 to 288 in 2007. Each year has also seen an increase in both the number of schools and the number of school districts represented at the Science Fair. Teachers and schools who had dropped science fairs from their programs have revived school and district level science fairs now that they are assured that their students have an opportunity to advance to a regional science fair that is a stepping stone to state and national level competition.

AFCEA Hampton Roads Chapter members have led the way in supporting the Tidewater Regional Science Fair by contributing more than 80% of total funds donated since 2004.

BIO-

Rear Admiral David O. Anderson, a native of Savannah, Ga., is a 1977 graduate of the University of Georgia. Following commissioning in October 1977, he attended



and completed flight training in Pensacola, Fla., and was designated a Naval aviator in July 1979. Rear Adm. Anderson completed initial A-6 training with Attack Squadron 42 (VA-42) and was selected as Replacement Pilot of the Year for 1980.

Rear Adm. Anderson then reported to VA-65 aboard USS *Dwight D. Eisenhower* (CVN-69), where he served as Landing Signal Officer (LSO). He returned to VA-42 in 1983 as an instructor pilot and was designated A-6 LSO of the Year for 1984. He reported to the Navy Flight Demonstration Squadron, the Blue Angels, where he flew the A-4 as Narrator and Opposing Solo for 1985-86 before transitioning to the F/A-18 as Lead Solo pilot for 1987. In October 1988, he reported to VA-85 aboard USS *America* (CV-66).

Transitioning to the Navy Reserve in July 1990, Rear Adm. Anderson reported to VA-0686 as Executive Officer. After the decommissioning of VA-0686 in November 1991, he transferred to Eastern Atlantic (EASTLANT) where he served as operations officer. From 1995 to 2002, he had four Navy Reserve commands. Rear Adm. Anderson completed numerous overseas assignments to Italy in support of combat operations in Bosnia and Kosovo. He has also deployed to Brazzaville, Congo; Tbilisi, Georgia and Sidney, Australia with various Joint Task Forces. He has served with numerous Carrier Strike Groups in support of Joint Task Force Exercises and represented 2nd Fleet to North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) for Joint Force Air Component Command issues.

After his selection to Flag rank in 2002, Rear Adm. Anderson was assigned as Deputy Commander, Network Warfare Command. He served as Director of Force Integration at U.S. Fleet Forces Command in 2003 and in October 2004 he was assigned as Deputy Commander, 2nd Fleet. During this tour he also served as Deputy Commander, Navy Region Mid-Atlantic. In October 2006 he reported back to U.S. Fleet Forces Command as Vice Commander.

His personal decorations include the Legion of Merit (4), Meritorious Service Medal (2), Navy & Marine Corps

Commendation Medal (4), and the Navy & Marine Corps Achievement Medal. He has accumulated over 4,500 hours in the T-28, T-2, TA-4J, A-4F, A-6E, and F/A-18 and logged over 650 carrier landings.
