What's in it for the Small Business?

Where Do Jobs Come From? New Analysis of Job Gains and Losses from the Office of Advocacy

Over a recent 15 year period, small businesses created some 65 percent of the net new jobs in the private sector, according to conservative estimates cited in a new report from the SBA Office of Advocacy. In *An Analysis of Small Business and Jobs*, Advocacy economist Brian Headd notes that many of the new jobs are in new business startups, but an even larger share are in expanding firms of all sizes—particularly mid-sized firms with 20-499 employees.

“More and more, we’re finding that both new startups and ongoing high growth firms have important roles to play in the labor market,” said Acting Chief Counsel for Advocacy Susan M. Walthall. “Fast growing firms scattered across the economy create a large share of jobs—and because no one can predict which idea will be the next to catch on, it’s important to create an environment in which a wide spectrum can start up and expand.”

Advocacy’s analysis of the quarterly Bureau of Labor Statistics data show that over the 15 years from 1994 to mid 2009, 31 percent of net job gains (jobs created minus jobs lost) came from the opening of new establishments. An even larger share—the remaining 69 percent—were from ongoing firms of all sizes that expanded. (These net figures are based on establishment openings minus closings and establishment expansions minus contractions.)

The business cycle is an important factor in the net creation or loss of jobs. In the current downturn, firms with fewer

than 20 employees began losing jobs as early as the second quarter of 2008. From 2008 to the second quarter of 2009, these smallest firms accounted for 24 percent of the net job losses, while those with 20-499 employees accounted for 36 percent; the remaining 40 percent of job losses were in large firms with more than 500 employees.

The Office of Advocacy, the “small business watchdog” of the federal government, examines the role and status of small business in the economy and independently represents the views of small businesses to federal agencies, Congress, and the President. It is the source for small business statistics presented in user friendly formats, and it funds research into small business issues.

The Tidewater Science Fair was held on Saturday, March 13, 2010. There were 291 projects were accepted for display at the fair (197 in the Junior Division, 94 in the Senior Division). These Projects included entries from 9 public school districts, the New Horizons Governor's School for Science and Technology, and four private schools. In the Junior Division, there were projects from 23 middle schools. In the Senior Division there were projects from 14 high schools. More 291 students applied to enter the fair, but physical limitations of the venue limited the number that could be accepted. The Tidewater Science Congress

He and his staff are responsible for a service contract portfolio estimated at \$550M annually, and interface with all service contract customers within the Command and a variety of supporting contracting offices throughout the Department of Defense and other Federal agencies. He has served most recently as the Assistant Chief of Staff and Director of Contracts and Logistics at the Naval Personnel Development Command, Norfolk, VA, and Fleet Support Division Director in the Contracting Department of the Fleet and Industrial Supply Center, Norfolk, VA.

Mr. Brunner spent several years as the Executive Director of the Naval Center for Acquisition Training in Norfolk, a component of the Naval Postgraduate School, and as the Associate Dean of the Norfolk Campus of the Defense Acquisition University. His additional extensive contracting experience includes Contracts Office Head at the Naval Sea Combat Systems Engineering Station, Norfolk, VA; Senior Contract Administrator, VSE Corporation, Alexandria and Chesapeake, VA; Contracting Officer, Deputy Competition Advocate, and Contracts Division Director, Naval Supply Center Norfolk, VA; Contracting Officer, Naval Regional Contracting Center (now FISC DET), Philadelphia, PA; and Contract Specialist, Aviation Supply Office (now NAVICP), Philadelphia, PA.

Mr. Brunner received the 2006 Public Sector Partner of the Year award from the Professional Services Council, the Northern Virginia Government Contractors Council, and Washington Technology as a result of his role in founding and participating in two Tidewater Virginia organizations dedicated to intra-Governmental, intra-Industry, and Government/Industry collaboration that have strengthened Government partnerships with the private sector and fostered change in the procurement community.
